Deadlines

Make sure you fully submit your completed application with all required supporting documents:

Study period	Nomination and application deadline
Autumn semester (September to January) Full academic year (September to June)	Saturday 14 May 2022
Spring semester (January to June)	Saturday 15 October 2022

The following schools have one application deadline in **May** for either autumn or spring semester:

- School of English
- School of Physics

Only complete applications will be considered. It is your responsibility to ensure your application is complete. Any delays due to missing/incorrect supporting documents may result in us being unable to process your application or provide an offer.

Before you apply

Before you start the application form, make sure you have the following ready:

- an electronic copy of your most recent academic transcript
- an electronic copy of your English language certificate/test result if English is not your first language
- a letter from your home university confirming your nomination

You need to allow plenty of time to complete the application. After you have created an account, you are able to save it and come back to it any time before you submit it.

English proficiency and academic requirements

English language requirements:

Where English is not the official/majority language students must submit evidence of English language proficiency. If supporting documents are not received, this will result in delays in providing offers. All conditions on offers must be met before students can register. Our minimum entry requirements are shown in the following web page: [English language requirements](#)

The University of Nottingham does not accept institutional certificates as evidence of English proficiency. If provided, they will not be considered and will delay the processing of an application where an approved certificate is not received.

Academic requirements:

All applicants must be current students at an overseas university or college of higher education and must have completed at least one year of study at their home university, prior to their study abroad period.

The minimum academic requirement is a current overall average equivalent to a 2:2 in the UK. Country specific guidance can be found [here](#), please note that grade equivalencies will be found under Masters-entry requirements.

Notes on exceptional requirements and module selections

Please ensure you are aware of the below requirements prior to application, this information is also available on our [webpages](#) along with the [module catalogue](#).

School or Department	Exceptional requirements and/or module information
The Department of Chemical and Environmental Engineering	Is only open to their own partner institutions as capacity is limited.
The Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences	Do not accept visiting students except for the School of Life Sciences, but certain criteria may need to be met.
The Department of Architecture and Built Environment	Require a portfolio to be submitted in addition to the application with the following exception: <i>We do not require to see a portfolio for Erasmus applicants as we always assume that because we have an Erasmus agreement in place that the quality of the course has been checked and is considered to be of an equal standard as the University of Nottingham. If like Nottingham, there is a competitive process then this should ensure that the student is of a sufficient standard.</i>
Environmental Sciences	Is located at University Park
School of Chemistry	Are happy to consider students into Y1 or Y2 for the full year, or for one semester, or the whole year in Y3 or Y4. In all cases, please liaise with visiting students' team for further guidance.
Politics and International relations	Modules will only be available to students being hosted by this School.
School of Economics	Students wishing to take School of Economic modules and who are not hosted under School of Economics at UoN , will have a limited number of

	modules available to them. Please do check our Module catalogue carefully for availability.
Department of Electrical and Electronic Engineering	Are happy to consider students for our Level 1 and 2 modules (Years 1 and 2) for the full year exchange only, single semester exchange students will only be able to enrol on the more advanced Level 3 or 4 modules. In all cases, please contact visiting students' team to ensure that your module choices can be accommodated.
The following courses are not available for visiting students:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Arts - Foundation • Business Foundation • Genetics and Human Genetics • Foundation - UK and EU • Molecular Sciences • Science Foundation
Only available through a specific exchange agreement:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Medicine and Surgery • Midwifery • Nursing • Pharmacy • Physiotherapy and Rehabilitation Sciences • Social Work • Veterinary Medicine and Science

Course information

While at Nottingham, students must study the following:

- 30 credits per semester from their host school (where a valid agreement must be in place)
- minimum 50 credits and maximum of 70 credits overall per semester
- minimum 100 and maximum 120 credits for a full year
- a normal credit load would be 60 per semester


30 credits must be accounted for from the host school, per semester, students are then able to study the additional required credits from any other school if: they meet any pre-requisites, there is capacity, the courses are not year-long if studying for a semester and there are no timetable clashes.

Please ensure you check with your home institution which school/department the agreement covers before you apply.







Navigate through the next few screens and select the following options:

- Select your course level: undergraduate or postgraduate taught as appropriate. If you are unsure, please check with your home university.

Please ensure you log into NottinghamHub to check your application status regularly and if your application is successful, you will receive an offer by email.

All conditions on offers must be met and you must have an unconditional offer before you travel.

Once you have received your offer through NottinghamHub, you must login and **accept** your offer to apply for university accommodation and register with the University on arrival.

Once you have accepted your offer, you will receive an 'acceptance letter' which will be uploaded to your portal.

If you are here for one semester only you will require a visitor visa letter. This will be uploaded to your portal once you have accepted an unconditional offer. You need to check your portal regularly for information and uploaded documents.
